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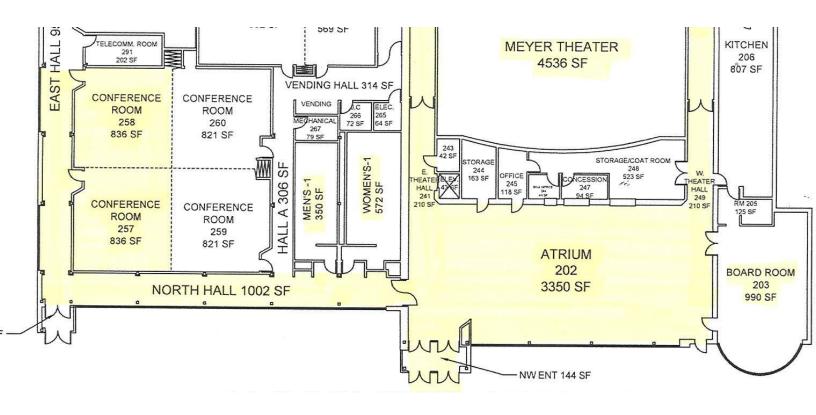

Matt has raised more than \$1.5 million in grant funding and diversified the organization's revenue. Previously, Matt was the Executive Director for TV Santa Barbara, the Multimedia Services Supervisor for Louisville Metro Government, the Cable Television Coordinator for Lake County, Illinois, and Meridian Township, Michigan. The Alliance for Community Media recognized Matt with the National Buske Leadership Award in 2013. Matt has taught media production at Antioch University Santa Barbara and Bellarmine University in Louisville. Matt has a Master's Degree in Media Arts from Michigan State University, and a Bachelor's degree from Western Michigan University.

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Michael J. Watza

Mr. Watza is Chair of the Governmental Regulatory Practice Group at Kitch, a full service Law firm based in Detroit, with offices in Lansing, Marquette, Mt. Clemens, Chicago, Ill., Toledo, OH and Honolulu, Hl. Mr. Watza's practice provides litigated, legislative and regulatory solutions on behalf of municipal, health care and private sector clients, concerning Legislation, Complex Litigation, Governance Issues, Telecommunications including Cable and Cell Towers, Pipelines, Energy, Insurance and Gaming. He is a Michigan registered lobbyist. Michael also serves as Outside General Counsel to PROTEC, a consortium of over 100 Michigan Municipalities. He is also Outside General Counsel to Merit Network, a Michigan University Affiliate engaged in developing the Internet and hi-speed low cost access to it since 1966. He also Chairs the Novi EDC, Michigan Attorney Grievance Commission Grievance Panel #9, and the International Municipal Lawyers Telecommunications Committee. He was twice appointed by Governor Granholm and Snyder, to the Michigan Gaming Control Board, serving there for 8 years.

Mike has also served as Special Projects Counsel to the Michigan Municipal Risk Management Authority. Michael has served as an adjunct faculty member at Michigan State University College of Law teaching Communications Law & Policy and Ethics and the Practice of Law and the Michigan State University Institute for Public Utilities. In 2008, Michael successfully opposed Comcast's effort to move PEG channels to the 900 digital channel range resulting in, among other things, an apology by Comcast to Congress. He is presently leading PROTEC's effort to take back local public ROW by a series of legislative initiatives before the new 2023 Michigan Legislature.

Public Media Network collecting and sharing local narratives centered on the themes of life that touch us all. This offer is for the people who are not often given a voice in media.

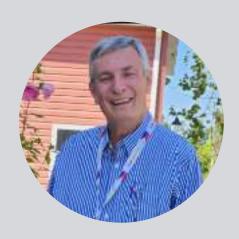

Bobb Vergiels has one of the most recognizable voices in Southeast Michigan and Northwest Ohio. He got his start in commercial radio in 1970 in Monroe but has really made his mark behind a microphone in the sports world, announcing more than 4,100 professional and collegiate sporting events since 1991. His stops include the Detroit Tigers for 15 years, University of Michigan basketball for 11 years, the Detroit Lions for 10 years and minor league hockey for nearly 25 years. (In fact, on Jan. 5, 2024, the Toledo hockey team will honor Bobb with a bobblehead.) Three years ago, he returned to radio, hosting the music show "Bringing Motown to Our Town" on Rewind 94-3 and "Bobbing Around Monroe," a talk show on an internet radio station. He's also the most sought-after emcee in the Monroe area, and has hosted Monroe visits by the President and Vice President of the United States.
